### **ITEMS FROM THE FLOOR**

1. **Dean Heyenga** – Trinidad  
Requested that a proposal to add a public restroom to the Library facility be included on the October 1<sup>st</sup> Council meeting agenda.
2. **John Spyropolous** – Trinidad  
Asked that the Council consider longer office hours, supports police moving to new facility, asked that the City ban the prisoner transport from Pelican Bay from stopping at Chevron, and urged the community to support True Value Hardware by shopping there often.

### **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

1. Discussion/Decision regarding hiring of new Building Official. (Bhardwaj/City Clerk)  
*Motion (Bhardwaj/Ratzlaff) to approve contracting with Ron Zemel as Trinidad's Building Official, provide up to \$1300.00 in reimbursement for professional liability insurance expense for one year, and authorize the Mayor to sign the contract on behalf of the City. **Passed unanimously.***
2. Approval of the Knapp minor subdivision and coastal development permit following the recommendation of the Planning Commission, approving the Tentative Map as submitted and as conditioned, and adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the project. (Bhardwaj/City Planner)

*Motion (Ratzlaff/Bhardwaj) to adopt the information in the staff report, and following the recommendation of the Planning Commission, approve the Tentative Map as submitted and conditioned, and adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the project. **Passed unanimously.***
